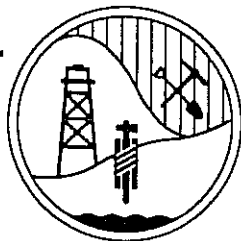

ROCKY MOUNTAIN MINERAL LAW FOUNDATION

The purpose of the Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Foundation (RMMLF) Scholarship Program is to encourage the study of natural resources law by well-qualified law students.

Joe Rudd was a prominent natural resources attorney in Alaska for whom the original scholarship program was named. Since 1980, 102 Joe Rudd Scholarships and 72 Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Scholarships (established in 1993) have been awarded, for a total of \$565,000.

Tuition scholarships are available for the full scholastic year, 2006-2007, as well as separately for the spring and fall 2007 semesters. Approximately \$55,000 per year is available for Joe Rudd and RMMLF scholarships. **This flyer is only for RMMLF Spring 2007 Scholarships.**

➤ **Purpose.** The objective of this program is to encourage the study of natural resources law by well-qualified law students who have the potential to make significant contributions to scholarship in natural resources law.

➤ **Eligibility.** A law student enrolled at one of the Foundation's Governing Law Schools who can demonstrate a commitment to study natural resources law or who is undertaking the study of natural resources law shall be eligible for a scholarship. The tuition scholarship must be used at, and will be paid directly to, one of the Governing Law Schools listed below.

➤ **Amount of Scholarships.** Full year Scholarships, \$4,000-\$8,000; Spring Scholarships, \$2,000-\$4,000.

➤ **Criteria for Selection.** The following criteria will be used by the Scholarship Committee:

- potential to make a significant contribution to the field of natural resources law
- academic ability
- leadership ability
- year in law school
- financial need

All applicants must submit five (5) copies of this application, five (5) copies of their law school transcript (undergraduate transcript for first-year students), and five (5) copies of their Law School Data Assembly Service (LSDAS) report, which includes LSAT scores, to Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Foundation, 9191 Sheridan Blvd., Ste. 203, Westminster, CO 80031. **Photocopies are acceptable.** Canadian students do not have to submit LSDAS documents.
3. Letters of reference from two individuals who can speak from personal knowledge concerning the applicant's character, ability, and potential to make a significant contribution to the field of natural resources law should be sent directly to the Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Foundation, Attn: Scholarship Committee. If presently in law school, one reference preferably should be from a law school professor.
4. All documents necessary to complete this application must be received by the Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Foundation by October 16, 2006. Applications received after this date will not be considered.
5. Applicants will be notified of results by January 12, 2007.
