

# Quick review: Mead and Kisor

- Major Questions doctrine
- U.S. v. Mead Corp. (2001)
  - Did Congress delegate the power to make binding determination?
  - And did the agency actually use it?
  - Notice-and-comment rulemaking and formal orders – gold standard, but deference allowed for less
- Kisor v. Wilkie neutering Auer deference
