This committee was appointed by the President after Cynthia Freeman and Laura Oren met with him to request action on security concerns on campus. The committee investigated and issued a report on sexual assault problems on this campus. Subsequently, we drafted policy and procedures which were accepted and promulgated by the President.

Sexual Harassment Policy and Procedure Implementation Committee, 1991-95.

This committee was appointed with the limited charge of developing strategies and materials for training and educating the University community about sexual harassment, an issue that was first covered by University policy in 1990-91. After this, however, we began to monitor the effectiveness of those policies and systematically review them. We concluded that it was necessary to train high-level administrators in enforcement and to contemplate changes in existing policy and procedures. I urged the President to consult Dr. Bernice Sandler, a nationally-known expert on the problem of sexual harassment in education. I organized a "Working Conference on Sexual Harassment Policy and Procedure at the University of Houston" for December 10, 1993. Dr. Sandler reviewed our policies and procedures and conducted training sessions for administrators, committee members, and the Sexual Harassment Grievance Board. The long-term outcome included expansion of the Office of Affirmative Action to a more realistic staff level and significant revision of University policies and procedures. I also served as one of the principal drafters of the new policy that was approved by the President.
