

**LOGISTICS FOR VISIT TO  
CES ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES SUPERFUND SITE**

Our class will visit the CES Environmental Services Superfund Site on September 27, 2018. This site is located very close to the University of Houston, and it offers an excellent example of an abandoned hazardous waste site, highlights environmental justice issues at Superfund sites, and also demonstrates a classic environmental crime. Robin Morse, with Crain Caton & James, will join us to discuss strategies for redevelopment of contaminated sites and legal tools to protect buyers from potential environmental liabilities.

The CES Environmental Site is located at 4904 Griggs Road. We will meet at 10:00 am in the entranceway adjacent to the Site that CES used for truck deliveries. Do NOT go past the road barriers in the driveway that currently block access to the Site. Our visit should last no more than 60 minutes.

In addition to Superfund legal issues and environmental justice concerns, we will also talk briefly about how the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) might apply to this type of operation and why federal hazardous waste regulations failed to prevent the creation of an abandoned waste site at this site.

You will not need any special clothing or personal protective equipment for this visit. Be prepared, however, for a little sun and (possibly) mosquitoes. We will reschedule our visit if the weather is rainy that morning - check both your emails and the website for potential postponements.
